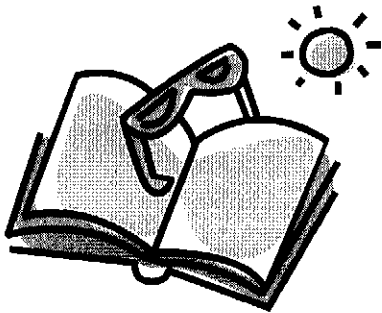

***Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, &
Thursdays for 5 weeks.***

Location: ASSURE Center 105 Westview Drive, Washington
(Next to Washington Kirkwood Center)

Purpose: Credit recovery. Opportunity for 9-12 graders to
make up failed classes/get caught up on their credits.

Cost: \$50.00 fee per class/credit, limit of 2 classes/credits. No
exceptions. The fee is non-refundable and due upon
registration.

Who To Contact if You Are Interested: Contact
your building Guidance Counselor if interested. They will give
you the Summer School Guidelines and let you know what classes
to take. This is **required** before registering for summer school.

Registration: will take place at the ASSURE Center on
Monday, June 9th from 7:00 A.M. - 6:00 P.M.

● **Classes will start on Tuesday, June 10th at 9:00 A.M.** ●

***Class work will be independent study. Attendance is required and all
material will be due on July 10, 2014 at or before 1:00 P.M.***

Washington Community School District Summer School Contract 2014: Grades 9-12

In order for a student to receive credit in the WCSD Summer School, the following guidelines must be met:

1. Summer school is only for credit recovery (students that are behind in credits OR have failed a class). Attending summer school to get ahead credit wise is not allowed.
2. A registration fee of \$50 per class is required for each student to attend summer school, no exceptions. This fee is also nonrefundable and due upon registration. There is also a limit of no more than 2 classes/credits. It is **required** that the student/parent talk to a guidance counselor to find out what class(es) should be taken. **Registration will be on Monday, June 9, 2014.** Register anytime that day from 7AM to 6 PM at the ASSURE Center, 105 Westview Drive, Washington.
3. All requirements for the course must be met. This usually includes completing a workbook, chapter reviews, chapter tests, and a course project.
4. The requirements must be completed and turned in by or on the last day of summer school, which is July 10, 2014. It is possible to finish before that date.
5. It is possible to be at summer school 16 hours a week. A student must be at school all hours of the week until their classes are completed. **Class will be held on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursdays for 5 weeks (June 10 - July 10).** It will start at 9:00 AM and end at 1:00 PM each day. Any changes to this schedule will be announced.
6. Students and parents must take responsibility for the student's attendance. Summer school staff will keep track of the number of hours a student is in attendance. Students that are not attending class time may be dropped from the summer school program.
7. Students must take responsibility for asking questions and getting the most out of the opportunity provided.
8. Textbooks will need to be returned in good condition. If a textbook is damaged, lost, or not returned, the student/parent will be charged a damage/ replacement fee.
