



REQUIRED VACCINES FOR SCHOOL

AGES: 11 and up

IS YOUR CHILD PROTECTED?

✓	Tdap <i>(Tetanus/Diphtheria/Pertusis)</i>	REQUIRED for all students entering 7 th grade and above if born on or after September 15, 2000
	Meningitis <i>(recommended)</i>	A serious bacterial illness covering the brain and the spinal cord <i>(Most colleges REQUIRE this vaccine)</i>
	Varicella <i>(recommended)</i>	(Chickenpox) <i>(Most colleges REQUIRE 2 doses of this vaccine)</i>
	Hepatitis A <i>(recommended)</i>	A serious liver disease spread by close personal contact or by ingesting contaminated food or water. Highly recommend for travel
	HPV <i>(recommended)</i>	(Gardasil) Protects against CERVICAL AND OTHER CANCERS and certain diseases.

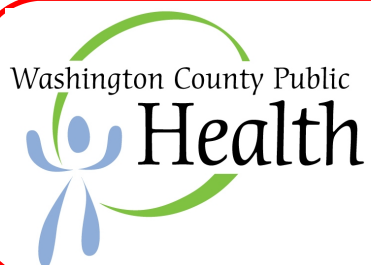


Someone infected with HPV may never know they had it. Left untreated it can cause health problems from genital warts, infertility due to infections and Cancer. The best way to prevent the most common types of HPV is to receive the 3-dose series of HPV!
